## **School Information**

The school opened in the fall of 2006 and graduated its first senior class in the spring of 2010. The school is situated on ten acres in Miami-Dade County. The school is located in a middle class residential neighborhood. The geographical situation of the school is very appealing because of its proximity, major highways and Broward County. Colleges and Universities such as Miami Dade's North Campus, Miami Dade's Broward Campus, St. Thomas University and Florida International University are within short driving distances allowing our students to enroll and participate in these settings. Our school not only offers a first class educational program, but also offers a convenient and accessible campus. Mater Lakes Academy is a comprehensive middle/ high school enrolling over 2100 students in grades 6 through 12. The student body is a diverse population composed of 93% Hispanic/Latino, 3% Black, 3% White, and 1% other.

## **Accreditation and Membership**

Mater Lakes Academy is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and holds memberships with the College Board, the National Association of Secondary School Principals, and the Association of Secondary Curriculum Development.

## **Academic Schedule**

The school's academic program is organized on a traditional bell schedule. Students are assigned seven (7) credits per year as the maximum course load; students take all seven classes on a daily basis. The school day is composed of (7) 45 minute classes. Annual credit (1.0) courses are year-long and semester courses (0.5) are half the year.

## **Curriculum**

Advanced Placement Program courses offered at the school include: Art History, Art 2D Studio, Biology, Chemistry, Physics 1, Physics C, Environmental Science, Computer Science (Principles and A), Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, Macroeconomics, English Language, English Literature, European History, World History, Government (United States and Comparative), Human Geography, American History, and Psychology. AP Language classes offered include French, Italian, Spanish Language, and Spanish Literature. Advanced Placement is an open-enrollment program.

The Scholars Program enables sophomores, juniors and/or seniors to enroll in college courses and earn college credits at local institutions of higher education. A Higher Educational Institution that works together with Mater Lakes Academy is Miami Dade College. The Scholars Program aims for students to earn an Associates of Arts degree from Miami Dade College and Doral College.

The school has instituted a Prep AP program for its Middle Grades students. This program will give students the opportunity to experience the rigors and expectations of the Advanced Placement curriculum in preparation for High School Advanced Placement courses.

District policy eliminated class rank beginning with the Class of 2009. Students rank is distinguished by their Grade Point Averages and the categories are separated by: Suma Cum Laude, Magna Cum Laude and Cum Laude.

### Grade Point Average (GPA) Calculation

GPA's are computed using the above quality points. Beginning with grade 9, all subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. A minimum of 24 credits is required for graduation. In addition to the required 24 credits, each student graduates with 28 credits which allow students to achieve higher GPA calculations and exceed both State and District requirements. AP and Dual Enrollment courses are weighed by two extra points and Honors classes are weighted by one extra point. Grades are recorded on the official transcript and grade point averages are recalculated in January, June, and August.

## **Advanced Placement Results for 2020**

- In May of 2020, 475 students took AP exams
- In 2020, a total of 954 exams were taken in 25 subject areas.
- In July of 2020, 78% of the AP Exams received scores of 3, 4 or 5.

## **Post-High School Placement**

The 2020 graduating class comprised of 312 graduates.

- 77 students graduated with Bright Futures Scholarships
- 80% of students graduated with over 25 or more college credits
- 39 students graduated with an Associate's Degree
- Two students earned \$1,000 academic scholarships from the uMater Foundation.
- The school had 100% of its seniors meet requirements for graduation.
- 96% of graduates were college bound, having enrolled in programs at MIT, George Washington University, NYU, UF, FSU, Nova Southeastern, Barry, UCF, USF, Duke, and Carnegie Mellon, Miami Dade Honors College, St. Cloud Tech, Pensacola State, FIU Honors among other colleges and universities.
- 18 students received scholarships to Both NCAA and NAIA affiliated schools.
- 27 students from the school's Early Childhood education program received their CDA certifications.
- 12 students graduated with their EMT certification
